

Birthstone of the Month - Garnet

The garnet is both the birthstone for January and the gem to celebrate a second anniversary. Though it's most frequently known for its brilliant red coloration, the garnet also grows—as crystals inside metamorphic rock— in a range of colors, including orange, fuchsia, yellow, and even blue. According to the Gemological Institute of America, rarer still is the green garnet, known as a tsavorite, found outside a national park in Kenya in 1967. Use any color of this stone to celebrate your favorite January birth or anniversary.

Flower of the Month - Carnation



The carnation is the flower for January. Also known as a clove pink, this versatile flower is a species of the genus Dianthus, a term that means "divine flower" in Greek. Carnations are native to the Mediterranean and have been cultivated for over 2,000 years. The festive, sweet-scented blooms were used in ancient Greek and Roman

ceremonial crowns and now come in a rainbow of colors, including pink, purple, blue, yellow, green, orange, white, and striped.
